On April 15, 2007 the Cleveland Indians will honor Jackie Robinson in recognition of the 60th Anniversary of Robinson breaking the color barrier in Major League Baseball. In addition to his accomplishments on the field, Jackie Robinson was also a forerunner of the Civil Rights Movement. He was a key figure in the establishment and growth of the Freedom Bank, an African-American owned and controlled entity, in the 1960s. In recognition of his accomplishments on/off the field, Robinson posthumously received a Congressional Medal of Honor and the Presidential Medal of Freedom.
